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## Things to Do In Positano

### HIKE THE PATH OF THE GODS

The Path of the Gods or in Italian, "Sentiero Degli Dei," is a spectacular walking trail on the Amalfi Coast that ends in Nocelle, above Positano.

The path is almost 5 miles and takes about 3 hours, but it is an easy trail to hike if you walk from Agerola to Nocelle as the route, in this direction, runs downhill with magnificent views of the Amalfi Coast and the island of Capri.

TRAVEL TIP: if you are short on time or simply want the views without the climb, take a taxi up to Bomerano di Agerola and hike (most flat to downhill) to Nocelle. Grab lunch in Nocelle and decide whether to walk down (1700 steps) or take a taxi/shuttle down to Positano.

### SHOP IN POSITANO

In the village center, there are tons of cute clothing boutiques, ceramic shops, souvenir shops, and art galleries.

Where to shop - Stroll down the hill towards Chiesa di Santa Maria Assunta and Spiaggia Grande from Piazza dei Mulini. The main shopping streets are Viale Pasitea and Via Cristoforo Colombo.

The colorful ceramics that the Amalfi Coast is known for is thanks to local red clay mixed with limestone - the perfect medium for this craft. In the boutiques of Positano you'll find traditional pieces with botanical motifs and bright hues, as well as modern hand painted interpretations. Don't worry about breakages and the weight of your luggage, shipping is readily available.

- Ceramica Casola (Via Laurito, 49) - family run workshop with gorgeous hand made pieces
- Emporio Della Ceramica (Via C. Colombo 21) - wide variety of pieces and attentive owners

Crochet and white linen dresses, tops, and pants can be found everywhere as well as lemon candy, lemon soap, lemon-scented perfume, limoncello, and pretty much anything lemon flavored you could possibly want!





# Eating in Positano

## FOR DINNER

There are tons of great restaurants in Positano, but I recommend trying La Tagliata (located up in the mountains) for dinner one night. The amount of food (and wine) you get for the price is insane, and the food is excellent!

For a romantic fine dining experience, you must try Rada Restaurant. It is on the water, built into a cliff literally underneath Hotel Marincanto, so to get to dinner you can walk straight down the beach path.

For fine dining, head up to Montepertuso, a hamlet high over Positano for either Donna Rosa or Il Ritrovo.

## FOR LUNCH

There are tons of great spots right on the beach, but I like Chez Black and L'Incanto.

## GOOD PIZZA IN POSITANO

Finding good pizza is an important activity in my opinion because you can't go to Italy without dedicating at least one meal for pizza.

For delicious pizza in Positano try Capricci, which is located in the center of town near the church. This pizza place is budget-friendly and offers the perfect place to people watch with a view of the ocean!

## MORE OF MY FAVORITE POSITANO RESTAURANTS

Il Ristorante Al Palazzo in Palazzo Murat great courtyard. Built on Roman villa which was built on top of monastery. Palazzo Murat named that because Murat- Napoleans brother in law frequented here.

Buca di Bacco Ristorante - I always ask for the outdoor dining. It has a covered terrace

Buca di Bacco's La Pergola and/or Bar on the beach level good lunch, aperitivo
