What follows is a checklist of some of my favorite coffee cafes in Rome that you may consider visiting.

Here are a few phrases to get you started ordering your coffee in Italy:

*"Un caffè, per favore"*, which translates as "A coffee, please."

*"Un caffè"* is the simplest and most popular coffee in Italy, and it's what non-Italians would call a shot of espresso.

*"Un Americano, per favore"*, which is "I would like a American coffee, please"

Made of a shot of coffee cut with hot water after it is pulled, I'm of the (admittedly biased) opinion that there's no reason to ever order an Americano until you've at least tried more Italian coffees. When in Rome...,right?

Remember to check the opening hours of the cafes. Of you are planning to have more than just a coffee, consider making reservations for some of these popular cafes, especially during peak hours, to ensure a pleasant experience.

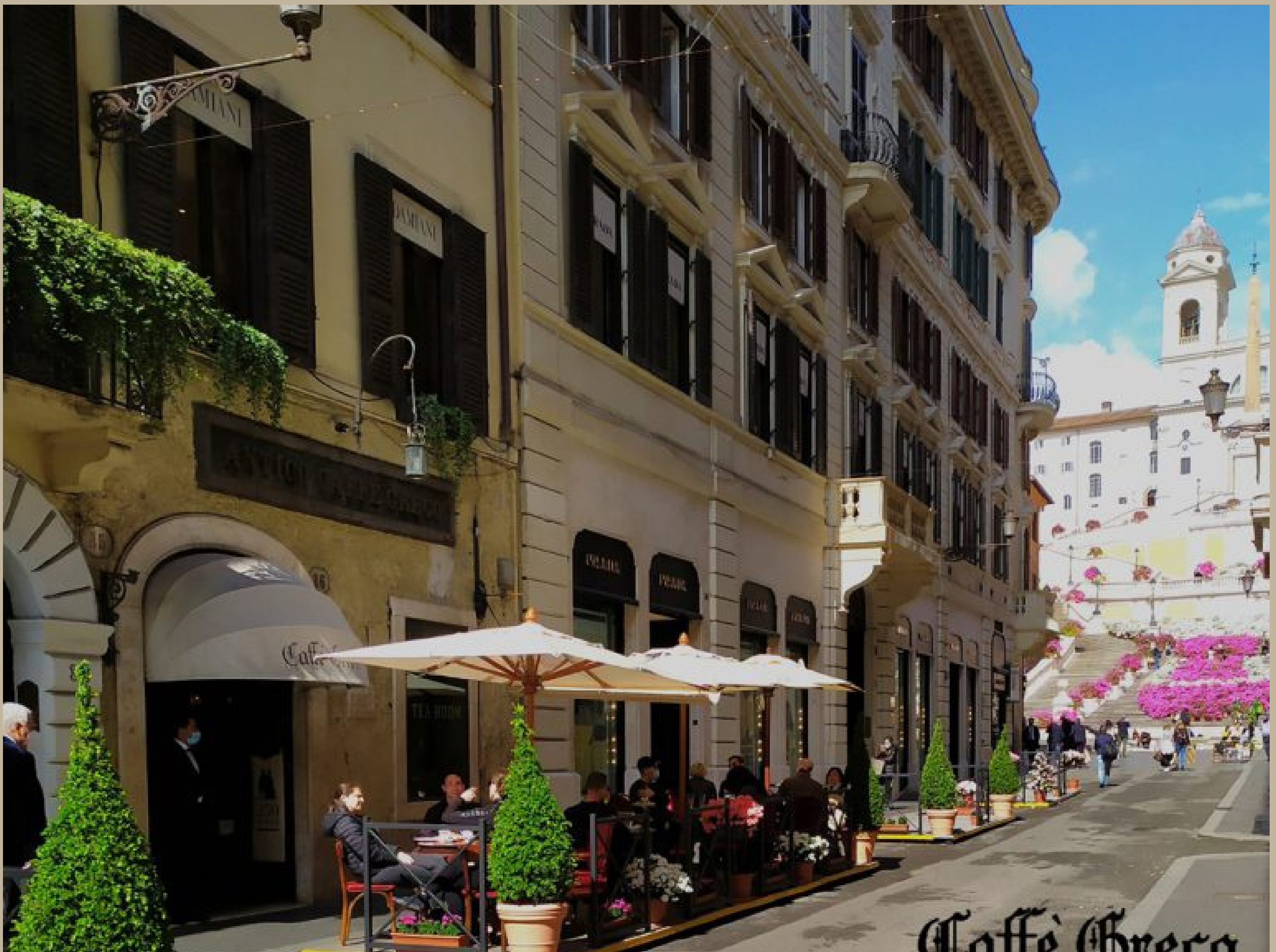
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## Antico Caffè Greco
