What to See

Chiesa di San Nicolo di Capodiminte

Chiesa di San Nicolo di Capodimonte, perched on a hill overlooking the picturesque village of Camogli, offers a serene escape. Inside, the church reveals a rich history with beautiful frescoes and intricate altar pieces, reflecting the artistic heritage of the region. The panoramic views of the Ligurian Sea from the surrounding area are simply breathtaking.

The Maritime Museum of Camogli

The Maritime Museum of Camogli is named after its founder, Gio Bono Ferrari, author of the book "Sailing Trilogy"; one of the best renowned scholar of the history of the Ligurian sailing navy and, in particular, of Camogli. Paintings, photographs, models and documents on display are gifts from Camogli families. They represent only a small testimony of the over 2,900 sailboats belonging to Camogli residents and later acquired and armed by captains and military sailors in the period between the Napoleonic wars and World War I.
